• The purpose of the SSAE grant is to improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of States, local educational agencies, schools, and local communities to provide all students with access to a well-rounded education, improve school conditions for student learning, and improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students. (ESSA Sec.4101)


Title IV-A Resources



Allocations & Eligibility

Allocations

Title IV-A allocations for LEAs are calculated by formula based on the proportion of those LEAs' prior year's Title I, Part A allocation.

SEAs are further required to ensure no LEA receives an allocation less than \$10,000 (minus any required Maintenance of Effort reductions), and must ratably reduce LEAs accordingly to ensure the minimum amount requirement is met.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive an allocation under the Title IV-A Student Support & Academic Enrichment grant, a local educational agency (LEA) must have received funding through Title I-A in FY17 (school year 2016-2017).

Consortiums

LEAs may choose to submit an application as part of a consortium. LEAs seeking to use this option must contact <u>Title IV-A staff</u> for next steps.

Equitable Services

Under sections 8501-8504 of the ESEA, LEAs receiving funds under Title IV, Part A must provide for the equitable participation of private school students, teachers and other educational personnel in private schools located in areas these agencies serve in Title IV, Part A-funded activities, including by engaging in timely and meaningful consultation with private school officials during the design and development of their Title IV, Part A programs.

New or changed requirements that affect the equitable participation of private school students, teachers and other educational personnel under the ESEA are addressed in <u>USED Non-Regulatory Guidance: Fiscal Changes and Equitable Services Requirements under the ESSA</u>. Except as otherwise provided in that guidance, the existing non-regulatory Title IX, Part E Uniform Provisions, Subpart 1 – Private Schools (Revised March 2009) will remain applicable.

Transferability Options

Under the ESEA, LEAs may transfer funds they receive by formula under certain programs to other programs to better address State and local needs.

Programs to which an LEA May Transfer Title IV-A Funds

- **Title I, Part A** Improving basic programs operated by LEAs
- **Title I, Part C** Education of migratory children
- **Title I, Part D** Prevention and intervention programs for children and youth who are neglected, delinquent, or at-risk
- Title II, Part A Supporting effective instruction state grants
- Title III, Part A State grants for English language acquisition and language enhancement
- Title IV, Part A Student support and academic enrichment grants
- Title V, Part B Rural education

LEAs seeking to use this option <u>must</u> contact Title IV-A staff for next steps on how to leverage this flexibility.
