Robin Lithgow (Los Angeles USD Elementary Arts Coordinator; College Board)

Robin Lithgow is the Elementary Arts Coordinator for the Arts Education Branch of the Los Angeles Unified School District. She was born into a theatre family and raised backstage, and is probably one of the only people on earth to have seen all of Shakespeare's plays (over and over again) before the age of 12. A graduate of Barnard College, with a masters degree from Cal State Northridge, she has taught and done theatre with students from kindergarten through high school for twenty-five years.

As Theatre Specialist, and now Arts Coordinator Robin Lithgow has worked to embed substantive and sequential arts education into the core curriculum of all LAUSD schools from kindergarten through twelfth grade. LAUSD's Arts Program Schools are growing in numbers every year, and will have arts theatre teachers in 310 of its 500 elementary schools. She also currently serves as the theatre specialist for the College Board.

Scott C. Shuler (Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, Simsbury Public Schools, Connecticut) – Music Reviewer

Scott C. Shuler is Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction for the Simsbury Public Schools. He came to Simsbury from the Connecticut State Department of Education, where he served for 17 years as Arts Education Consultant. Previously he taught 3-12 instrumental and general music and conducted church choirs in Michigan, Delaware, and Wisconsin; taught music education courses at several universities, including the Hartt School, Eastman School of Music, and New England Conservatory; and served as Associate Professor and Coordinator of Music Education at California State University, Long Beach. Dr. Shuler earned his B.Mus. at the University of Michigan, his M.S. at the University of Illinois, and his Ph.D. at the Eastman School of Music. He has authored many publications, served on MENC's *UPDATE* editorial board, and presented countless workshops on topics such as music program development and assessment, teacher preparation, advocacy, and the role of the arts in middle schools. He was a member of the task force that developed America's National Standards in music; helped design and interpret the 1999 federal arts education survey and 1997 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) in the Arts; co-chaired the Council of Chief State School Officers' SCASS multistate arts assessment consortium; and served as president of the National Council of State Supervisors of Music. Shuler received Arts Education Policy Review's "Young Writer's Award" for excellence as an author; the Educational Press Association's "Distinguished Achievement Award" for editing the *MEJ* special issue focusing on "Music and At-Risk Students;" "Distinguished Service" and "Outstanding Administrator" awards from Connecticut's music, art, and theatre associations; California State University's "Meritorious Performance Award," Wisconsin's "Legislative Citation for Excellence," and the National Federation Interscholastic Music Association's regional "Outstanding Music Educator Award."

Dale Schmid (New Jersey Department of Education; President, National Dance Education Organization)

Dale Schmid is the Arts Education Director for the New Jersey Department of Education. In his leadership role in New Jersey, Mr. Schmid has created a national model for collecting arts education data from all 2000+ New Jersey schools; is rolling out a high stakes assessment process for New Jersey's vocational performing arts schools; and has led the state through standards development and revision. A former professional dancer, Mr. Schmid currently serves as President for the National Dance Education Organization, where he has overseen the creation of revised national dance standards and a set of professional practice guidelines for dance educators. Mr. Schmid continues to perform as a dancer, actor and musician, at times with his wife, a Philadelphia-based installation artist.

Roger Tomhave (Fine Arts Coordinator, Fairfax County Public Schools, Virginia) – Visual Arts Reviewer

Roger Tomhave is the Art Fine Arts Coordinator for Fairfax County Public Schools. Dr. Tomhave oversees the K-12 fine art program delivered by over 1,000 certified dance, music, theatre arts, and visual arts teachers for 138 elementary schools, 25 middle schools, and 25 high schools. He is a previous recipient of the National Supervision/Administration Art Educator of the Year, the Virginia State Art Educator of the Year, and the Southeastern Region Supervision/Administration Art Educator of the Year for the National Art Education Association. Under his tenure in Fairfax County Public School, Fairfax arts curricula were recognized for excellence by the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities. In 1997, the Getty Education Institute for the Arts used Fairfax County Public Schools as the model and demonstration site to train evaluators in assessing visual arts programs across the nation. Previously, Dr. Tomhave supervised the art education student teacher program; taught methods in art education for elementary education majors; and taught coursework for art education majors at the University of Minnesota. Dr. Tomhave also was appointed as part of a staff development team for The Minnesota Consortium for Improving Visual Arts Education providing a program endorsed by the National Diffusion Network to 38 school districts. Dr. Tomhave earned his Doctorate and Master's Degree from the University of Minnesota, his Bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin.
