RE: Runaway, Homeless, and Migrant Youth, 2004 Reauthorization Act

Runaway, homeless, and migrant children are now categorically eligible for free meals effective July 1, 2004.

• Local education agencies (LEAs) must document a child's status as either runaway, homeless, or migratory.

How do you document runaway, homeless, or migratory status?

- <u>Homeless children documentation</u>: Refer to **CN memo #08-03** on "documenting free and reduced price eligibility of homeless children in the Child Nutrition Programs". LEA officials may accept documentation that a child is homeless from the **local educational liaison** or **directors of homeless shelters**. This documentation must include:
 - Child's name
 - Effective date(s)
 - Signature of the local educational liaison or the director of the homeless shelter
- If a homeless family or child temporarily reside with another household, the **host family's income is not taken into consideration** when determining whether the homeless family is eligible for free and reduced price meals.
- If **host family** applies for free and reduced benefits, they **may include the homeless family as household members** if the host family provides financial support to the homeless family (shelter, clothing, food, etc.).

<u>Runaway or migrant children</u>: There are no documentation provisions currently. Further guidance will be provided in the future.
