ARIZONA MUSICFEST SCHOLARSHIP

Arizona Musicfest is pleased to announce the seventh year of the organization's Scholarship Program, which awards generous scholarship funds to an Arizona high school senior pursuing a college-level instrumental performance degree, classical voice degree, or degree in music education. Applicants must be Arizona residents graduating in 2017 and enrolling in a college-level instrumental performance, classical voice performance, or music education program before December 31, 2017. The deadline for submitting the Scholarship Application is **April 10, 2017**.

The 2017 award amount will be \$2,500; paid directly by Arizona Musicfest to the recipient's school of attendance. Arizona Musicfest provides \$2,500 (renewable for up to 4 years) to a graduating high school senior who will pursue a music degree at a college or university.
