Name tags, reserved seating with teacher

A common language about family engagement

Sense of urgency presentation (Baseline Data)

Large, readable grid of class-wide reading and/or math scores Visual markings where all children need to be to pass AIMS Personal notice where the family's child scored on class wide grid The value of family engagement explained

Immediate Engagement (Your Child's Prescription)

Initial family engagement training by classroom teacher(s)

Specific growth needs for each family's child

Hands-on experience in sessions to support reading and/or math (3 per year)

Take-home assignment materials

Scheduled reporting back to parents on individual student's progress

Coaching and support for home learning (At-home roles)

Work together at home on prescribed assignments with school provided materials Maintain logs on student interaction with assignments and return to teacher each week Progress updates from teacher to parents

Families encouraged to observe reading and/or math in child's classroom at any time Families can always meet with teacher at any time.

Celebrate the family engagement results (Growth Data)

Progress of school-wide family engagement compiled School and community presentation Results presented at the next year's initial family engagement event
