Supporting LEA Efforts to Implement Educator Effectiveness Systems and Arizona's College & Career Readiness Standards

Recognizing the impact of teachers and principals on student achievement, states are emphasizing the urgent need to create and implement quality, comprehensive, strategic systems for evaluating teacher and principal performance in a manner that will identify, support and develop educator effectiveness and increase student academic growth. As state and local policymakers are responsible for the design, development and implementation of evaluation systems using multiple measures, including student growth, it is critical they are familiar with emergent research, promising practices and strategies related to the design of teacher and principal evaluation systems and uses of the resulting data.

Summits I – VII have focused on components of the educator evaluation process including the use of multiple measures to guide implementation for improving teacher effectiveness and learning. Summit VIII is an encore to the educator evaluation series designed to assist Arizona LEAs in determining outcomes that are a part of a roadmap to improving teaching and learning.
