



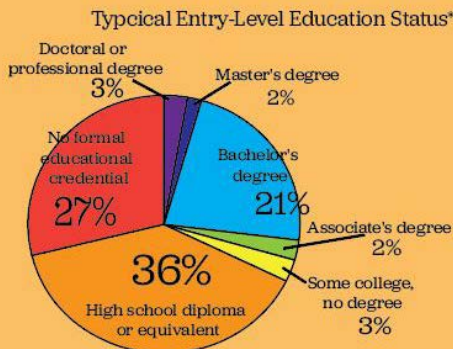
Apache County Arizona Adult Education

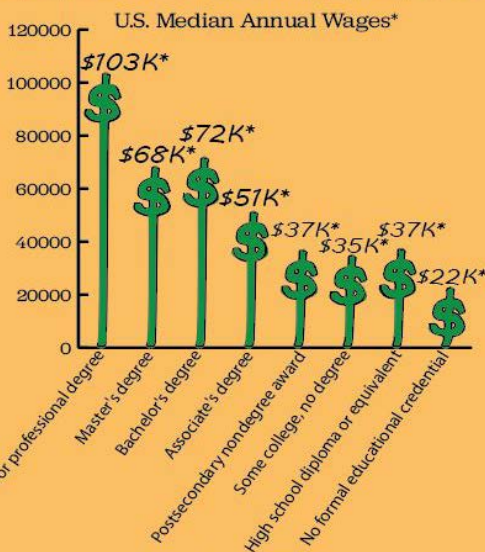
In Arizona, providers must meet rigorous standards and produce positive student outcomes to be funded. Northland Pioneer College is funded and authorized to provide adult education throughout Apache County. The Arizona Department of Education - Adult Education Services allocated \$46,603.16 to Apache County for adult education services for the Program Year 2016-2017.

Of the approximately **72,124** people living in Apache County, **70%**(50,387) are 18 years of age or older.

Of that statistic, **24%**(11,963) lack a high school diploma or high school equivalency credential.

1,327 16 to 19 year olds are not enrolled in school and do not have a high school credential.

3,548 adults 18 years of age and older live in "linguistically isolated" * households. **

*all members of the household, 14 years and over, have at least some difficulty with English



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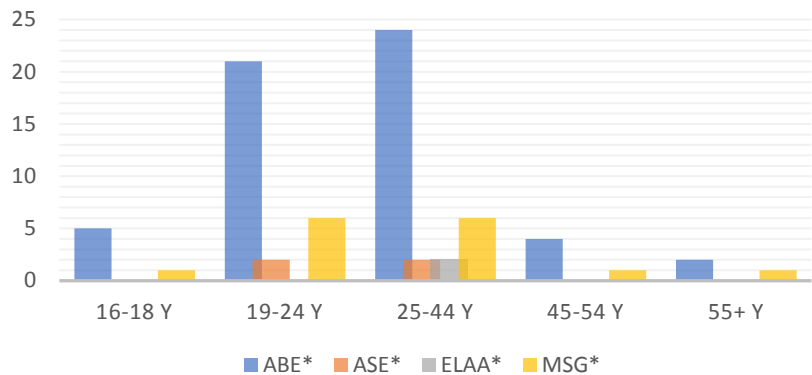
Snapshot

- 45% of adult learners in Apache County are between the ages of 25 and 44.
- 21% of adult learners in Apache County are between the ages of 16 and 21.
- 37% of adult learners in Apache County are employed.
- 87% of the adults in Apache County enrolling in adult education classes had reading, writing, and/or math proficiency skills below the ninth-grade level.
