



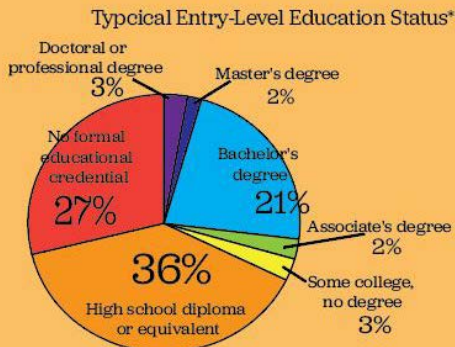
# La Paz County Arizona Adult Education

It offers access to quality educational opportunities to support employment, job training and higher education aspirations. By assisting adult learners to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary for effective participation in society, we help citizens realize their potential, businesses benefit and communities thrive. 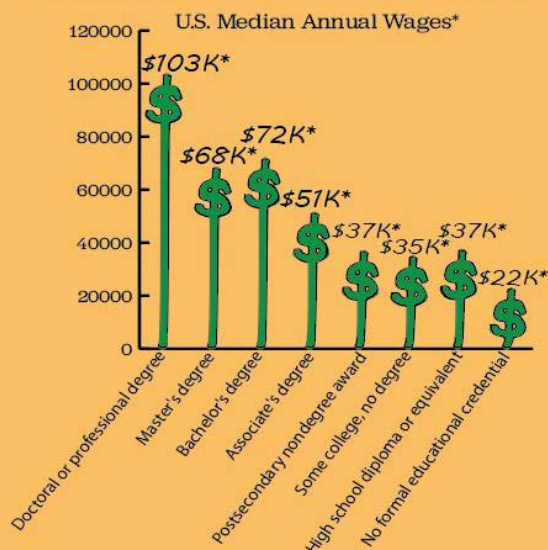
meet rigorous standards and produce positive student outcomes to be funded. Mohave Community College and La Paz Career Center are funded and authorized to provide adult education throughout La Paz County. The Arizona Department of Education - Adult Education Services allocated \$104,034 to La Paz County for adult education services for the Program Year 2016-2017.

## ★ Community Need



Of the approximately **20,335** people living in La Paz County, **83%**(16,819) are 18 years of age or older.

Of that statistic, **24%**(4,075) lack a high school diploma or high school equivalency credential.

**329** 16 to 19 year olds are not enrolled in school and do not have a high school credential.

**704** adults 18 years of age and older live in "linguistically isolated" \* households. \*\*

\*all members of the household, 14 years and over, have at least some difficulty with English



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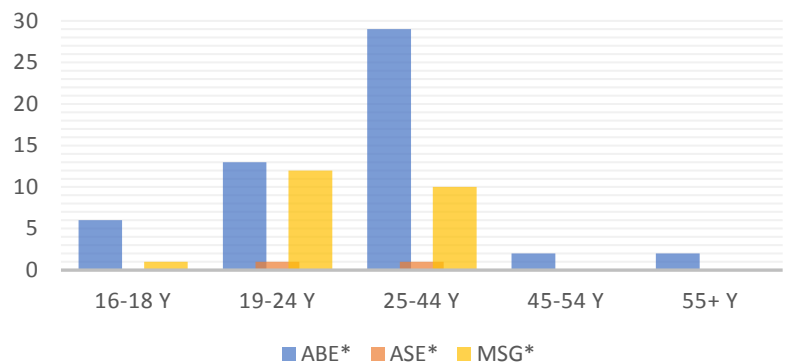
## Snapshot

- 55% of adult learners in La Paz County are between the ages of 25 and 44.
- 34% of adult learners in La Paz County are between the ages of 16 and 21.
- 47% of adult learners in La Paz County are employed.
- 97% of the adults in La Paz County enrolling in adult education classes had reading, writing, and/or math proficiency skills below the ninth-grade level.
