Navajo Nation Oral Language Proficiency Criteria for Navajo Bilingual Seal

Definition of Navajo Language Proficiency: Student <u>must</u> be able to speak accurately, easily, conjugate verbs correctly, convey meaning through complex sentences, and communicate effectively and competently.

Seal of Navajo Bilingualism:

- Proficiency assessment for graduating high school seniors only.
- Schools must register on-line at the Department of Diné Education at least 10 days prior to testing date.
- Seniors must complete the assessment at one of scheduled locations and dates.
- Seniors have the option of retaking the assessment.
- An official letter from Navajo Nation with the test result will be sent to the student's respective school within 15 working days.
- School official(s) will notify students of test results.
- Only those students who successfully pass the proficiency assessment will be recommended by their school official (s) to the State.

Content of Bilingual Seal Assessment:

- 1. Appropriate introduction of self (clan, born for, maternal grandfathers, paternal grandfathers, where their mother's home area is, their parents and grandparents, related clans, personal interests, hobbies, goals, etc...).
- 2. Oral presentation on a given topic. (Topics provided by OSCAD)
- 3. Answer a set of questions. (Questions provided by OSCAD)
- 4. Summary/analysis of a video clip on a cultural topic.
- 5. Entire assessment must be performed in Navajo.

Scoring Criteria

- 1. Scoring will be based on a language proficiency rubric in the following categories:
- Introduction
- Oral Presentation
- Answering Questions
- Summary/Analysis of Video Clip

Test Administrators:

- 1. Test administrators will consist of 4 individuals one OSCAD staff, two school district staff, and one community member.
- 2. All test administrators must be proficient in Navajo language and must have experience working in the field of education.
