- Improve Learning Outcomes For All Children
- Close the Learning Gap

#### School Readiness Framework

- 1. Common definition
- 2. Use of effective instruction, standards, curriculum, and assessment
- 3. Family engagement and partnerships
- 4. Quality transitions into kindergarten



#### **School Readiness Definition**

Arizona's young children will demonstrate school readiness through the Essential Domains of:


- Language and literacy development
- Cognition and general knowledge (including early math and science)
- Approaches to learning (curiosity, initiative, persistence, creativity, problem-solving, confidence)
- Physical well-being and motor development
- Social and emotional development



The purpose of the PDG, offered through the US Department of Early Learning, is to assist states in developing and enhancing capacity to deliver high-quality preschool programming and implement and sustain high-quality preschool for eligible children.

#### **Overview**

The PDG is a competitive sub-grant that will allocate funds for the provision of *HIGH QUALITY*, as outlined in the Program Guidelines for High Quality and as measured by the Quality First System.






#### The Award

Arizona wrote for and received \$20 Million annually for up to 4 years totaling \$80 Million during the preschool development phase.

Between fiscal years 2016 to 2019, **65%** of the funding will go directly to Arizona **sub-grantees** on a cost-reimbursement basis to provide high-quality, comprehensive preschool program services for age- and income-eligible children.





35% will be used by the State for infrastructure development needed to support high-quality preschool systems

- Increased access to Quality First (Mental Health Consultation, Inclusion Coaching, Child Care Health Consultation)
- High level coursework leading to teacher certification (AZ Registry)
- Institutes of Higher Education capacity building efforts
- ADE Longitudinal Data System (SLDS)

### **Age Eligibility**



Support programming for children who may not otherwise have access to high quality preschool during the <u>year prior to their kindergarten entry.</u>

- PDG funded children must be 4 years old prior to September 1 of the fiscal year.
- Children age eligible for Kindergarten should go to Kindergarten.
- Evidence of age eligibility must be provided by family, verified by program, and kept in children's files

### **Income Eligibility**

- Family income eligibility must be at or below 200% of FPL
- Evidence of income eligibility must be provided by family, verified by program
- Families will not be charged additional costs to attend the PDG program


#### **Programmatic Requirements**

- Participate in QF
- Connect to the AzSLDS
- Implement Arizona
   Early Learning
   Standards and adhere to
   Program Guidelines for
   High Quality
- Implement an evidencebased curriculum

- Provide prep time for all instructional staff
- Participate in *ECQUIP* in collaboration with other sub-grantees and partners


### **Fiscal Requirements**

- Budget and submit a grant application through programs <u>ADE Grants</u> <u>Management System (GME)</u>.
- Show evidence of leveraged ("matching") funding at a minimum of at least 25% of total award funding.
- Retain original and legible documentation of goods and services purchased with PDG funds.




#### **Program Operational Hours**

- Provide Full Day/Full Time Services:
  - A minimum of 24 hours per week
  - A minimum of 4 days per week
  - 6 hours a day
- Provide 9-10 months of programming depending on the Local Education Agency
- Align school year with the Local Education Agency calendar




#### **Ratios**

- Do not exceed an instructional staff to child ratio of 1:10
- Do not exceed a total class size of 20 children



#### **Child Assessment**



- Engage in formative assessment activities used to inform individual instruction and program improvement
- Use the Arizona State Board of Education approved, online tool for ongoing progress monitoring
- Participate in training in appropriate use of the online tool
- Obtain Arizona Education Data Standards (AzEDS) numbers for all enrolled PDG children

#### **Comprehensive Services**

#### **REQUIRED**

Develop written policies for and implement:

- Least Restrictive Environment
- Child Find (including screenings)
- Family Engagement

### OPTIONAL COMMUNITY SERVICES

- Family Resource Centers
- Food Security
- Parent Kits
- Parent Outreach and Awareness
- Literacy Support
- Care Coordination, Medical Home
- Oral Health

# High Quality Staff Qualifications

#### **Director Minimum**

Bachelor degree in ECE, CD, FS,
 ECSE, OR hold a principal's certificate
 through ADE

#### **Teacher Minimum**

- Bachelor degree in ECE, CD, or closely related field
- Provisional/Standard early childhood education certificate or endorsement (R7-2-608 & R7-2-615)

#### **Teaching Assistant Minimum**


- Associate degree in ECE/CD; OR
- CDA credential in ECE/CD; **OR**
- College Certificate in ECE/CD

### **Staff Compensation**

- Compensation and benefits are adequate to support the hiring and retention of highly skilled and highly qualified PDG staff
- Budget salaries that are comparable to the salaries of local Kindergarten educators with the same certification



### **Cooperation and Collaboration**



- Participate in the Early Childhood
   Quality Improvement Practices
   (ECQUIP) with local school district
   and other early childhood providers.
- Establish a consistent community of practice to collaborate with other subgrantees and local K-3 providers.

### Early Childhood Systems Building

Participate in a collaborative partnership within the community to establish a relationship that fosters seamless systems of early care and education:

- Ensure effective Kindergarten Transition
- Promote school readiness
- Establish a family engagement plan
- Coordinate services, recruitment, most in need selection criteria and a wait list sharing process
- Coordinate professional development efforts

#### Sustainability

Work towards effectively braiding early childhood funds and seek additional early childhood fund to sustain preschool services.

Collaborate with local partners and providers to sustain the quality improvement efforts.

Develop plans to sustain the funding and the quality of the preschool program.



#### Scope of Work (SOW)

Commit to complete all activities and tasks listed in the SOW including reporting such as:

- Kindergarten Transition Plan
- Family Engagement Needs Assessment and Plan
- Child Find Analysis
- Professional Development Plan
- Most-in-Need Selection Criteria Protocol
- Comprehensive Assessment Plan
- Least Restrictive Environment
- Waitlist Sharing Protocol

#### **Proposal and Award Process**

- Proposals available electronically via Survey Net February 1, 2018:

- Proposals due by March 1, 2018 by 5 p.m.
- Response letters (award and non-award) sent by March 9, 2018.
- PDG program must be fully operation by **August 30, 2018**. Fully operational is defined as having the specified number of children, based on allocation, enrolled and participating in the identified program activities.

- To submit a proposal for PDG funding, your program must:

   Be prepared to work as a collaborative partner in the mixed service delivery model; and
  - Be currently participating in Quality First (or be willing to apply for Quality First and will not decline an opportunity to participate).

If your program is awarded funds from the PDG, your program will agree to the following assurances and responsibilities through the <u>Grants Management System</u> (GME). The contents of this document are to inform you of the program's expectations. Your signature on this document does not imply an award of funding, and it does not create a legally binding document.

#### Assurances

The Sub-grantee hereby certifies and represents that it:

- Agrees to implement the Program Guidelines for High Quality Education, Arizona Early Learning Standards and the PDG Guidance Manual (an updated PDG Manual will be available for FY19.)
- Has all requisite power and authority to execute and fulfill the terms of this grant.
- Is familiar with the PDG and is supportive of and committed to working on all applicable portions of the
- Will implement the scope of work consistent with the budget of the State's Plan including existing funds, if any, that the Sub-grantee is using for activities and services that help achieve the outcomes of the State's Plan, and will comply with all of the terms of the Preschool Development Grant, and all applicable federal and state regulations, including laws and regulations applicable to the Preschool Development Grant, and the applicable provisions of EDGAR (34 CFR Parts 75, 77, 79, 80, 82, 84, 86, 87, 98 and 99), and the debarment and suspension regulations in 2 CFR part 3485.
- Will remain in good standing with licensing and Quality First which means: no major findings during compliance monitoring (i.e. financial, licensure, child safety) and are able to fully participate in ADE, DHS/DES or other applicable licensing, Quality First programs and no adverse action is pending.

#### Responsibilities

The Sub-grantee will:

- Participate in all relevant meetings or other events that are organized or sponsored by the State or Local High Need community.
- Post to any website specified by the State in a timely manner, all non-proprietary products and lessons learned developed using federal funds awarded under the PDG.
- Participate, as requested, in any evaluations of this grant conducted by the State, Education Department (ED), or Health and Human Services (HHS).
- Be responsive to State, ED, HHS requests for project information including on the status of the project, project implementation, outcomes, and any problems anticipated or encountered, consistent with applicable local, State and Federal Privacy Laws.



#### FY19 Highest Priority Selection Criteria



Enrolled and participating in QF **OR** currently on the QF waitlist

On tribal land or serving children who are tribal



Previously participated in PDG and in good standing



Licensed by a tribal, state, or federal licensing body and in good standing



Operates in a rural/underserved area

#### FY19 Highest Priority Selection Criteria



50% or more of proposed PDG Slots will be served by a teacher with a BA or higher degree.

50% or more of proposed PDG Slots will be served by a teacher with ECE or ECSE certification **OR** Proposed PDG teachers have an Associate Degree and/or are currently enrolled in a credit-bearing program working towards ECE/ECSE certification

#### FY19 Highest Priority Selection Criteria




Achieved quality levels in Quality First **OR**Program is accredited by a national early childhood accreditation agency
