 2.4 Implementation of evidence-based, rigorous, and relevant instruction (writing instruction – argumentative writing and conventions)

Root Causes

- No Board adopted writing curriculum to follow
- Teachers do not have the knowledge and skills to implement evidence based writing instruction

Need Statement

 Written, evidence, standards based curriculum implemented with fidelity, and professional learning for argumentative writing and conventions

Desired Outcomes

- Evidence based writing curriculum aligned to grade level and content standards implemented with fidelity
- Increased % proficient on writing assessment

Process SMART Goal

- By January 1, 2019, writing curriculum that is evidence and standards based will be adopted as evidenced by written documents.
- By February 15, 2019, evidence and standards based writing curriculum will begin implementation schoolwide as evidenced by lesson plans and walk through data

Student Impact SMART Goals 2019

- Overall proficiency will increase from 30% in 2018 to 40% in 2019 as measured by the district's writing assessment
- Increased ELA proficiency rate on AzMERIT from 20% in 2018 to 35% in 2019

Implementation Strategies

Strategy

Adopt an evidence and standards based writing curriculum

Action steps

- o Establish curriculum research committee
- Research available commercial curricula.
- Network with LEAs with similar demographics and high writing scores to look at their curricula
- Pilot top three selections in classrooms
- Select best fit curriculum
- Follow Board procedure to adopt a standards and evidence based writing curriculum

Strategy

Research and implement evidence-based argumentative writing instruction

Action steps

Establish a committee

- Research different pedagogy and methodologies
- o Select strategies to be implemented in all classrooms

Strategy

- Implement standards and evidence-based writing curriculum with fidelity
 Action steps
 - Develop curriculum maps
 - Provide additional time for teachers to explore, learn, and plan with new curriculum and resources
 - o Provide instructional coaching support to teachers

Strategy

- Provide consistent, high quality professional development and support for all teachers
 Action steps
 - o Provide initial training on curriculum adoption
 - o Provide academic coach support in classrooms
 - o Provide bi-weekly PD on curriculum and argumentative writing strategies
 - o Plan and ensure PLC sharing and discussions of resources used, student work and what works instructional strategies
 - o Plan and implement peer observations
 - Schedule and conduct administrative walk through observations with targeted feedback and teacher action plans

Strategy

Monitor Implementation (Formative)

Action steps

- Ensure teacher lesson plans reflect standards based objectives and evidence based instructional strategies
- Monitor teacher writing assessments and student writing samples
- Conduct administrative walk throughs
- o Implement targeted teacher action plans

Evidence/Success Criteria

- Increasing scores on monthly grade level writing samples, scored collaboratively
- Implementation of writing lessons from newly adopted curriculum

Action steps

 Determine successful completion of action steps and impact on student achievement

Evidence/Success Criteria

- Increases in proficiency on district spring writing assessment scores
- o Increased ELA proficiency on AzMERIT
- Meet Student Impact SMART Goal 2019
