What is a routine?

A sequence of actions regularly followed, a fixed program.

What is a ritual?

...consisting of a series of actions performed according to a prescribed order.

What is a rule?

one of a set of explicit or understood regulations or principles governing conduct within a particular activity or place.

Routines vs. Schedules

- The terms routines and schedules are often used interchangeably.
- Schedules represent the big picture—the main activities to be completed daily.
- Routines represent the steps done to complete the schedule.










Daily Schedule

- Blocks of time for classroom activities
- Sequence of classroom activities
- Preschool schedules typically include
 - Group Time
 - Choice Time
 - Snack Time
 - Outdoor Play
 - Story time








Things to Consider When Developing a Daily Schedule

- Balance of activities
- Number of activities available
- Number of Adults
- Child's development age
- Child's level of alertness
- Child's culture and language









What Makes A Good Daily Schedule?

Balance of Activities

- Active and Quiet
- Large Group and Small Group
- Indoor and Outdoor
- Child-Directed and Teacher-Directed
- Visual Cues picture schedule



Creating A Daily Schedule







Routines

- Activities and procedures that occur regularly
- Often involve a series of responses
- Preschool routines typically include the steps involved to satisfy the scheduled activity.







Example

Story Time

- 1. Gather on the carpet
 - 2. Get comfortable
 - 3. Stay in one spot
- 4. Open your listening ears
- 5. Listen to the teacher read
 - 6. Look at the pictures
 - 7. Answer questions

Why are Routines and Schedules Important?

- They influence a child's emotional, cognitive and social development.
- They help children feel secure.
- They help children understand expectations.
- They help reduce behavior problems.
- They can result in higher rates of engagement.







How do we teach routines and schedules?

- Routines and schedules need to be taught directly.
- Routines and schedules may vary.
- Based on level of children's interest.
- Should be inherently flexible (to allow for fire drills, field trips, etc.)
- Never ASSUME children will know how to do something.





Challenge	Cause	Solution
Children get restless and lose interest during circle time		
Too many children at one center		
Children play with their snack food		
Children do not pay attention during story time		
Children are restless during nap time		



Rituals What is it?

A classroom ritual is the process in which you complete a task.

Using a marker







Using a Marker

Selected the color

Take the cap off the marker tip

Put the cap on the back of the marker

Use the marker

When you're done return the cap to it marker tip

Put the marker back in its place






