

The <u>State Performance Plan</u>—Indicator 8: Parent Involvement—requires ADE/Exceptional Student Services (ESS) to annually submit survey data on the percentage of parents with a child receiving special education services who report that schools facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving services and results for children with disabilities.

Use the Indicator 8 Parent Involvement Survey question-by-question reports, including parent comments, to examine survey data. Several weeks after the survey closes on May 31st, question-by-question reports will be available to public education agencies (PEAs) and school sites that received six or more completed parent surveys.

The summaries are invaluable tools to strengthen and maintain family engagement initiatives. NOTE: Report details will be displayed only if your district or school had six or more completed surveys.


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Parent Involvement Survey Information

- 3. From the **Reports** dropdown menus select:
 - a. Report Name: Question by Question
 - b. Survey Name: 2018 Parent Involvement Survey
 - c. <u>District Name</u>: PEA name
 - i. Choose the PEA name and leave the school name box empty for the district-only data.
 - ii. Choose All and leave the school name box empty for the state-wide data.
 - d. School Name: Select individual sites, as applicable, from the dropdown menu.

4. Choose <u>View Report</u>, <u>Download Excel</u>, or <u>Download PDF</u> to view results.



Use the data to improve student outcomes!

- Although <u>a minimum participation rate isn't required</u>, the higher the amount of participation, the greater the likelihood the data will be representative of your agency's population.
 - Examine district-level and school-site results (e.g., patterns, performance, parent comments). It may be helpful to identify year-to-year trends.
 - Draw conclusions about the data. Keep in mind data quality and limitations, such as representativeness.
 - Share results with stakeholders. They might identify patterns and understand the meaning behind certain findings.
- Activate and sustain high-impact family engagement programs throughout the school year to strengthen and maintain positive parent involvement. Research confirms that family engagement improves student outcomes.
 - Partner with students, families, educators, and community leaders to repurpose or develop programs that will impact student achievement.
