Equitable Services

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Counting Eligible Private School Students ~ Low-Income: ESSA Section 1117(c)(1)

- As part of consultation, count the number of students from low-income families in **LEA Title I participating attendance zones** who attend a private school (inside or outside of LEA).
- Measure used to count private school students must be the same or comparable to measure used to count public school students
 - 2018-2019 Guidelines to Determine Eligible Students
 - 2018-2019 Guidelines to Determine Eligible Students Spanish
- Even upon consultation, the LEA retains authority to decide how eligible children will be counted.

Select Eligible Academically At-Risk Students

While the number of eligible private school students is determined on the basis of poverty data, **income is** *not* **the criterion to identify students for services.**

1. Private School Student **must reside** in one of the LEA's participating attendance zones;

AND


 Private School Student must be identified as at risk of failing* to meet the Arizona academic standards used to define proficiency by the private school.
 *Multiple academic criteria will be used to select students for Title I-Services. LEA has discretion to choose appropriate selection criteria.

Story of Three Private School Students

1st: These three students have been identified as **low-income based on poverty measure and they each live in a Title I boundary**. LEA confirms information received by Private School.



2nd: These two students reside in a Title I attendance area; AND they have met the criteria as 'academically at-risk'. These two students



Title I, Part A Proportionate Share Determination

ESSA Section 1117(4)(A)(ii), the proportional share of Title I funds for Private Schools shall be determined based on the total amount of Title I-A funds received by the local education agency (LEA) prior to any allowable expenditures or transfers.

Family Community Engagement

ESEA section 1116(a)(3)(A) requires an LEA to reserve and spend at least 1 percent of its Title I allocation to carry out required Title I parent and family engagement activities if the LEA's Title I allocation exceeds \$500,000.

LEA's Title I allocation	1% for parent and family engagement	Proportionate share '% for equitable services, multiplied by 'the 1% for parent and family.'	
\$4,080,250.00	\$40,802.50	\$150.97	This \$ figure goes into 3c.

1) LEA determines the participating public school attendance areas of Title I Schools <u>only</u>.

 LEA determines the number of children from low-income families residing in each participating area (Title I school/s) who attend 2a) public and 2b) private schools. 3) Total # of low-income families.

EXAMPLE: This LEA has 10 schools. Of those 10, only 6 are participating Title I schools. Only 4 participating private schools are in the LEA boundary.

The total # of low-income public school students = 3251 The total # of low-income private school students = 12 3251 + 12 = 3263 total

1) The Private School Proportionate Share is determined by dividing the total private school students from low-income familes (12) by the <u>total students</u> from low-income families at the (4 participating) private schools and LEA (3263). Therefore,

12/3263 = .0037 (rounded to four decimal places)

2) .0037 x \$4,080,350.00 = \$15, 097 (This is set-aside 3. Not 3a, 3b, 3c, 3d, or 3e)

LEAs allocation is greater than \$500,000. Family Community Engagement <u>must</u> be set-aside based on the following formula. To determine Family Community Engagement Share, the LEA multiplies the 1% Family Community Engagement set-aside 8 x the proportionate share percentage.

\$40,802.50 x .0037 = \$150.97

The \$150.97 is the minimum amount that must go into Set-Aside 3c.
