Educating visually impaired students is one of the most rewarding careers you can have as a teacher. And Mary Lou Fulton Teachers College is one of the few institutions in the U.S. that offers a full bachelor's degree leading to VI certification.

Our BAE in Special Education with a concentration in Visual Impairment, delivered in partnership with the Foundation for Blind Children in Phoenix, will prepare you to work with blind and partially sighted students in public and private schools, as well as other organizations that serve the visually impaired. It leads to a dual certification in Visual Impairment (birth–grade 12) and Mild-Moderate Special Education (K–12), and results in an English immersion endorsement to work with pre-K–12 English language learners.

- The program can be tailored to you: a four-year program for incoming freshmen or a two-year degree program for transfer students
- Classes in junior and senior years are offered in late afternoons or evenings, suitable for working paraprofessionals
- Coursework is offered in a combination of face-to-face, hybrid and online formats
- The curriculum is aligned with Arizona and national standards consistent with the Council for Exceptional Children
