

Implementation Guide

To ensure our students are prepared for college, career, and civic life, Arizona has adopted new History & Social Science Standards that foster a rigorous and relevant K-12 education.

In a government where the final authority and sovereignty rests with the people, our local, state, and federal governments will only be as responsive as the citizens demand them to be. Preparing students for contemporary society cannot be accomplished without a strong emphasis on civics, economics, geography, and history – the core disciplines of the social sciences. It is imperative that each generation gains an understanding of the knowledge, skills, and dispositions to participate fully in civic life. Engaging students in the pursuit of active, informed citizenship will require a broad range of understandings and skills by thinking analytically, reading widely and critically, and communicating cogently in a compelling manner.

The following support document is provided as a guide describing the transition process to the newly adopted History & Social Science Standards for implementation by the 2020-2021 school year. Phase 1: Awareness & Exploration Spring & Summer 2019

- Review the K-12 Arizona History & Social Science Standards. Determine your capacity for implementation and create a preliminary implementation timeline.
- Assess the professional learning needs of staff within the district.
- Create a district or site-level strategic implementation team.
- Create a district or site plan to ensure all K-12 teachers of social studies, receive the appropriate professional learning necessary for effective implementation of the new standards.
- Consider creating a collaboration of local or regional districts to share model lessons/units, evaluate resources, and coordinate professional development.

Phase 2: Transitions, Shifts, and Practices 2019-2020

Phase 3: Full Implementation 2020-2021

In the Classroom	Behind the Scenes
Students:	Teachers or Teacher Teams:
 Demonstrate deep understanding of standards through aligned classroom activities and lessons. Teachers: Actively evaluate lessons/units for alignment and revise instruction based on evaluation. Develop comfort locating, modifying, and using instructional materials that are aligned to the standards. Differentiate instruction and provide appropriate scaffolding to ensure the standards are accessible for all students. Use student performance on aligned classroom assessment to guide instruction. 	 Continue to engage in professional development offered on deepening your understanding and implementation of standards-aligned instructional practices. Work with grade level teams to continue developing lessons/units that build towards full alignment with the standards. Consistently evaluate lessons, units, and instructional resources and modify to more completely align with the standards. Use student artifacts as evidence of learning and make instructional decisions based on that evidence. Continue to work in vertical and horizontal teams to ensure instruction is sequenced to provide all students opportunities to grow in accessing and mastering standards. Districts: Ensure teachers, administrators, and instructional coaches have access to the necessary professional development to support implementation. Focus walkthroughs and evaluations on student learning around new standards. Utilize district developed curriculum guides to create needed assessments or materials. Collect information from teachers on their instructional needs and enact professional development to ensure all teachers are comfortable with new curriculum. Conduct ongoing professional development related to integration of all aspects of the standards and to ensure the standards are accessible for all students. Support the district implementation team, PLCs and individual teachers in making decisions that are congruent with both the vision and content of the standards. Continue to have discussions about ways to improve K-12 social studies
