As we move into the break, this next video class will address an activity that parents can do with children over the summer vacation to keep up literacy skills.

Along with the objectives listed for the parents in the webinar, we continue to move forward on meeting the objectives of the Comprehensive Needs Assessment under the following categories:

#### Supportive Services:

- To provide parent education and books/materials/supplies
- To coordinate and collaborate with outside agencies...for additional support services to meet identified needs and support student learning and success.

#### Parent and Family Needs:

• To train parents to increase family literacy skills and learning strategies for helping children with reading and homework.

#### Goal 2: School Readiness:

- To provide sufficient information, resources, and practice strategies to parents to support their children.
- To provide parents with strategies to support their children's academic success

This activity will be slightly different than previous ones. The directions are for parents to complete the activity and their child will be the helper. The parents' homework assignment is to have their child create and write an origami accordion book over the summer and bring it back in the fall to share. By doing this "backwards" we remind parents that they are their child's first teacher.

Per usual, please view the video before sharing it with families. The video and activity will take about an hour to complete. Be sure that you prep enough materials so that each child will be able to make one or more origami accordion books over the summer. You may want to have childcare available for children younger than five.

# Supply list for Everyone has a story: Origami Accordion Book

#### **Bookmaking materials for the webinar – Origami Accordion Book:**

- Cut construction paper into 9 X 9 squares. (From 9 x 12 Construction paper, it is easy to cut in to 9 X 9 squares).
  - a. Prepare 10 or more <u>squares</u> of paper of for each participant Reminder: Cut enough squares for children to take home a set or two
  - b. Half of the paper needs to be white for drawing and writing. The other half of the paper can be any color. The more colors and paper to choose from, the better.
- 2. Handout Directions for the Origami Accordion Book
- 3. Pencils/pens/colored pencils and/or markers
- 4. Glue sticks
