#### What are EL Parent Advisory Councils?

#### Think about...

- using an organizational structure to create a forum for parents of English learners to learn and grow, and be decision-makers in your EL programs.
- equipping the parents of your ELs with valuable information they can use to help their children attain language proficiency and achieve success in school.

Parent Advisory Councils (PACs) empower parents to be advocates and supporters of the school's EL program because they have a personal stake in the program's success.



## Why EL Parent Advisory Councils?

Title III SEC 3115 (d) AUTHORIZED Subgrantee Activities

- (6) Providing community participation programs, family literacy services, and parent and family outreach and training activities to English learners and their families—
- (A) to improve the English language skills of English learners; and
- (B) to assist parents and families in helping their children to improve their academic achievement and becoming active participants in the education of their children.



#### **Connecting to Title III**

Activities must be supplemental to the families of eligible EL students and not also provided to the families of non-ELs through other funding sources.

- ✓ Activities must be above and beyond all other parent engagement activities sponsored by the LEA.
- ✓ Information shared must be in addition to the information LEAs are obligated to communicate under other laws to parents.

#### Supplement, Not Supplant

SEC 3115 (g)

Federal funds made available under this subpart shall be used so as <u>to supplement</u> the level of Federal, State, and local public funds that, <u>in the absence of such availability</u>, would have been expended for programs for limited English proficient children and immigrant children and youth and <u>in no case to supplant</u> such Federal, State, and local public funds.

Supplement = to add to; to go above and beyond Supplant = to replace

## How does this assist all parents of ELs?

- How is this activity above and beyond what the parents and families of non-ELs receive in the LEA?
- How is this unique to the EL students and their families?
- How will this improve the academic achievement of EL students?

- How does this meet the Title III requirements?
- Do parents and families of non-ELs in the LEA receive this through other funding sources?
- Is this communication to parents that is required under Title\_\_\_\_?

#### **ELPAC Organizational Structure**

- Host election
- ELPAC officers
- Topics specific to parents of ELs
- Calendar a minimum of 3 ELPAC meetings
- Evaluation

## The Accordion Envelope Book

- Parties (birthday, wedding, going away, graduation) have each guest fill out a card for the special guest




#### You Will Need:




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When you have finished your book, if you wish, you may share with the group
