Seal of Civics Literacy-Overview

A.R.S. §15-259 establishes the State Seal of Civics Literacy (Program)

This program recognizes high school students who have attained a high level of proficiency in Civics at the time of graduation

Proficiency determined by completion of a set of State Board of Education Approved Tasks

Seal is placed on diploma and noted on transcript

Getting Started

- Districts or Charter can choose to participate

 Designate a Program Coordinator

 Fill out an Intent to Participate Form (on webpage)
- Must be submitted by October 1st of the school year

Procedures for Awarding the Seal

- Electronic Copy of Seal sent to Program Coordinator in October
- Program Coordinator verifies all requirements met for each student applying for seal
- Program Coordinator prints seals
- Seal is placed on Diploma and noted on transcript
- Reporting form is completed and submitted no later than September 1st

Program Eligibility

Graduate from a District or Charter School in Arizona

Complete requirements during the four years of high school

Complete all Social Studies courses with a G.P.A of 3.0 or better out of a 4.0 scale

Pass the Arizona Civics Test

Complete portfolio requirements from each of the 4 categories:

Civic Learning Programs

Civic Engagement Activities

Service Learning and/or Community Service

Written Reflection

Category 1- Civic Learning Programs

- Choose 2 for the class of 2019-2020
- Choose 3 for the class of 2020-2021 and beyond

Choices are:

- 1. Civic Assessment-earn a 3 or higher on the Advanced Placement Government and Politics Exam
- 2. Summer Institutes and Intensives- the list of State Board approved programs will follow
- 3. Participation in JROTC- two year minimum
- 4. School sponsored extracurricular activities with civics focus- the list of State Board approved activities will follow

Category 3-Service Learning and/or Community Service

Must be for a public agency or charitable organization that serves the public good.

Enlistment in United States Military prior to graduation meets requirement.

Required number of service hours

Class of 2019-2020- 30 hours

Class of 2020-2021- 45 hours

Class of 2021-2022- 60 hours

Class of 2022-2023 and beyond- 75 hours

Written Reflection

Culminating activity to demonstrate civic knowledge LEAs will determine reflection criteria

Procedures for Awarding the Seal

- 1. Electronic Copy of Seal sent to Program Coordinator in October
- 2. Program Coordinator verifies all requirements met for each student applying for seal
- 3. Program Coordinator prints seals
- 4. Seal is placed on Diploma and noted on transcript
- 5. Reporting form is completed by the coordinator and submitted no later than September $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$
