# LEA Title I-D, Subpart 2 October Student Annual Count



### Intent and Purpose of Title I-D

- Improve educational services for these children so they have the opportunity to meet challenging State academic content and achievement standards;
- Provide them with services to <u>successfully transition</u> from institutionalization to further schooling or employment; and
- Prevent youth who are at-risk from dropping out of school, and to provide dropouts and children and youth returning from correctional facilities with a support system to ensure their continued education.



#### Definitions

- Neglected Children When used with respect to a child, youth, refers to an individual who has been committed to an institution (other than a foster home) or voluntarily placed under applicable State law due to abandonment, neglect, or death of his or her parents or guardians.
- Delinquent Children When used with respect to a child, youth, refers to an individual who resides in a public or private residential facility, other than a foster home, that is operated for the care of children and youth who have been adjudicated, delinquent or in need of supervision.
