Meal count totals by category for the month of review for Afterschool Snack were not correctly combined and recorded. Specifically, seven snacks during the month of review were underclaimed. This was deemed a non-systemic error.

Specifically, the grain component was not served as part of the breakfast meal on October 16. This was determined to be a non-systemic issue and will contribute towards fiscal action calculations.
