Accountability's Roles

A-F Letter Grade Calculations

- All letter grades
- Modeling data for future processes

Data Governance and Data Management

- Cleaning and aggregating data from across the state
- Ensuring the integrity of education data used in state level calculations
- Data storage and security

New and Existing Models for 2020




Which School Models will Receive a Letter Grade in FY 20?

K-8 Schools 9-12 Schools Alternative Schools


- Can be comprised of any combination of grades within the model (e.g. K-5)
- Schools crossing over K-8 and 9-12 models will receive a hybrid letter grade (e.g. K-12)
- Must meet all criteria for inclusion including:
 - N counts
 - Students must be enrolled for the full academic year
 - Must have testing data for 2+ years
 - Data must pass integrity checks
- AOI schools are expected to be able to view aggregated A-F data but will not receive an A-F Letter Grade in 2020






9-12 Model



What to Expect



Timeline

December 2019: Proposed recommendations were made to the State Board of Education

January 2020: Decision on proposed recommendations

April 2020: AzM2 will be administered

May 2020: Standard Setting for AzM2, Static File Phase I

June 2020: Static File Phase II

July 2020: Window to correct data is closed

August 2020: Preliminary aggregate A-F data is released

September 2020: Presentation of A-F to the State Board of Education

October 2020: State Board of Education finalizes A-F Letter Grades

November 2020: Final A-F Letter Grades are Posted

Sankey Diagrams




Longitudinal Analyses

- Following students over time, via their mathematics scores
- Looking at changes in progress between years
- Looking at long term academic pathways
- Comparing reclassified EL students to Never EL students



Students who Were Newly Reclassifed as Fluent English Proficiency in 2013

22192 started Grade7 in FY2013 (25.4%) & were [FEP=0 or 1] in FY2013: 70.0% graduated on time, 22.4% to community college, 11.7% to 4-year college



Patterns That We Will Continue to Study

- Following students over time
 - Looking at changes in progress over several years
 - Looking at long term academic pathways (post secondary)
 - Comparing reclassified EL students to Never EL students
- Many similarities between these two groups
 - The longer students are considered fluent, the more similar their graduation and community college patterns
 - University patterns may still differ
