If your SRO/JPO is remaining on campus, here are some suggestions of how he/she can serve your school community:

- In conjunction with your administrative team, familiarize yourself with the guidance provided on the Arizona Department of Education's webpage regarding:
 - o Pandemic Preparedness
 - o Guidance to Schools on COVID-19
- Work with your administrative team to review the Operational Plan and make any necessary schedule adjustments to accommodate school closures
- Develop collaborations with community resources, identifying services offered that could benefit students during school closures
- Work with community-based and youth recreational and leadership development activities that complement and reinforce the prevention-based approach of the School Safety Program
- Work with your administrative team to make any necessary home visits
- Conduct school safety assessments
- Work with the school safety team to review and update the school safety plan
- Plan in-service training
- Begin gathering data for the SSP Year-End Report
- Plan school security improvements
- Prepare law-related education lessons for future use.
- Establish and/or keep in contact with your <u>county/tribal public health</u> and local county/tribal emergency management agencies
- Visit the ADE website frequently for updates
- Collaborate with other SRO's and promote your successful interactions and community initiatives

If your SRO/JPO is **not** remaining on campus and going back to patrol duty, below are some suggestions of how he/she can serve your school community. Dependent upon your time and availability, here are ways to say connected to your community:

- Continue to build relationships with administrators, students, and community
- Get familiar with your school/school district's online classroom
- With administrator and teacher permission, join teachers in their online classroom/make cameo appearances in some of the lessons and check-in with students
- Dependent upon comfort level with technology, create short videos for students, staff, and parents to let them know you are still here to support them and ways you will be doing so.
- Provide training for parents and how they can keep their child safe online (ex. Internet safety)
