2 Quantities observed during the review period at lunch at Sunflower School did not meet weekly minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Due to the grain being short on Wednesday, the weekly grain requirement of 10 oz/eq was not met. This was determined to be a repeat finding from cycle two and contributed toward fiscal action calculations.

Discussed how current system allowed for this to happen and potential changes that could be made to ensure it doesn't continue, such as adding an additional grain on the day the toast is served.
