1 Meals served to teachers, administrators, custodians, and other adults were not priced so that the adult payment in combination with any per-lunch revenues from other sources designated specifically for the support of adult meals (such as State or local fringe benefit or payroll funds, or funding from voluntary agencies) for non-pricing programs. was sufficient to cover the overall cost of the meal. SFA is currently charging \$3.50 for lunch, which is less than the current minimum adult lunch price of \$3.75.

Resource Management

Discussed ways to determine adult meal prices which included a per meal cost analysis or pricing adult meals to reflect the amount of reimbursement received for a free meal plus the per meal value of entitlement and bonus commodities
