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1 Quantities observed on the day of review and during the review period did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern.

Specifically, the Chicken Sandwich, Spicy Chicken Sandwich, Peanut Butter Sandwich, Tuna Sandwich, Turkey Sandwich were the only grain items served on their respective day and did not provide a great enough contribution to meet the grain minimum for the K-8 weekly and 9-12 daily/weekly. This was not a repeat finding and did not contribute to fiscal action calculations.
