1. In addition to operating the SSO at Kin Dah Lichi'i Olta, the SFA is operating five bus route "sites" that have not been approved in CNPWeb.	Discussed the necessary steps to add bus routes as sites in CNPWeb. Discussed requirements of submitting site applications in CNPWeb and getting these site applications approved by SFSP Specialist.	SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please provide written assurance that CNPWeb site applications will be submitted and approved for all sites operating the SSO/SFSP in the future.		
2. Advertising materials did not contain the required nondiscrimination statement. Specifically, emailed communication advertising the SSO on 4/13/20 did not contain the nondiscrimination statement.	Discussed where to find nondiscrimination statement on ADE's website at http://www.azed.gov/hns/civilrights / and whether long or short statement would be most appropriate.	SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please provide written assurance that all advertising materials will include the required nondiscrimination statement in the future.

3. Documentation did not support that all required meal components were offered and served during the review period. Specifically, SFA requirements for the grade groups was not able to provide reviewer with lunch/snack production records for 4/22 and 4/23. Production records for 4/22 and 4/23 were either not completed, or were misplaced. Reviewer was unable to validate or determine if reimbursable lunch and snack meals were served to participants on these days. This contributed toward fiscal action calculations.

Discussed requirements for recordkeeping and meal pattern served.

SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please provide a written description of the changes that will be made in the recordkeeping process to ensure that documentation supports that the meal pattern requirements are met. Please provide written assurance that all documents pertaining to the school meal programs will be retained on file for at least 5 years, as is required by Arizona law.

4. Production records did not support that all required meal components were offered and served for snack on 4/21. A 1.16 ounce package of craisins were served crediting as 1/2 cup fruit when 3/4 cup fruit needed to meet snack meal pattern requirement. Additionally, no other item/component was listed on production records. This contributed toward fiscal action calculations.

Discussed recordkeeping requirements. Discussed the meal pattern requirements of the ASP. The ASP meal pattern table can be found on ADE's website at p/.

SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please provide a written description of the changes that have been made to the snack menu to bring it into compliance with the meal pattern requirements. Additionally, http://www.azed.gov/hns/nslp/ascs please provide written assurance that the ASP meal pattern will be adhered to at all times.

5. SFA did not submit a waiver to ADE and did not Discussed that ADE is permitted to keep daily records of meals with meal pattern deficiencies by component, per meal service when the meal pattern was not followed. Specifically: 4/20 = vegetable component was missing. Lead Cook was aware of meal pattern flexibilities in effect until June 1, 2020; however, she was not aware that a waiver must be submitted to ADE in order to utilize flexibility and component, per meal service. To that daily records for meals with meal pattern deficiencies, by component, must be kept on file to support use of meal pattern waiver. This did not contribute towards fiscal action calculations.

provide SSO meal reimbursements when the meal pattern is unable to be met by the SFA providing the meals due to shortages and/or supply chain issues. SFAs must maintain daily records of meals with meal pattern deficiencies by support the claim for reimbursement of meals, the SFA is required to provide a meal pattern waiver request form to ADE. Effective June 1, 2020, all meals claimed for reimbursement must meet the meal pattern.

SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please submit a waiver to ADE for each occurrence where the meal pattern was not met.

6. SFA did not submit a waiver to ADE and did not Discussed that ADE is permitted to keep daily records of meals with meal pattern deficiencies by component, per meal service when the meal pattern was not followed. Specifically: Specifically: 4/20 = milk variety/fat content was not met (2% white milk served) and 4/21 = milk variety/fat content was not met (2% white milk served). Lead Cook was aware of meal pattern flexibilities component, per meal service. To in effect until June 1, 2020; however, she was not support the claim for reimbursement aware that a waiver must be submitted to ADE in of meals, the SFA is required to order to utilize flexibility and that daily records for meals with meal pattern deficiencies by component must be kept on file to support use of 1, 2020, all meals claimed for meal pattern waiver. This did not contribute towards fiscal action calculations.

SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please submit a waiver to ADE for each occurrence where the meal pattern was not met.

7. Production records did not support that all required meal components were offered and served on 4/21. Specifically, milk was not recorded on lunch production record on 4/21; however, reviewer determined that 2% white milk was served on 4/21.

Discussed requirements for recordkeeping and meal pattern requirements for the grade groups served.

SSO program ended on May 7, 2020 and SFA is no longer operating. Please provide a written description of the changes that will be made in the recordkeeping process to ensure that documentation supports that the meal pattern requirements were met.

8. Quantities during the review period did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Specifically, SFA did not provide reviewer potential changes that could be with production records from 4/22 and 4/23; therefore, reviewer was unable to determine if the following daily or weekly quantity requirements were met: fruit requirement, vegetable requirement, M/MA requirement, grain requirement, milk requirement, and red/orange vegetable subgroup.

Discussed how current system allowed for this to happen and made to ensure it doesn't continue (i.e. changes in recordkeeping processes, etc.). Please provide a written description of the changes that have been made to ensure that fruit, vegetable, M/MA, grain, milk, and red/orange subgroup quantities meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Additionally, the certificate of completion of Step requirements for the National School by Step Instruction: How to Plan a Lunch Menu must be submitted.

9. The following vegetable subgroups were not offered during the review period: dark green, bean/pea (legume), and other. Specifically, SFA did not provide reviewer with production records Quick Guide can be found on ADE's from 4/22 and 4/23; therefore, reviewer was unable to determine if these vegetable subgroups www.azed.gov/hns/nslp/mealpatter completion of Step by Step Instruction: How to were met during week of menu review.

10. Production records for snack provided did not Discussed required sections of contain all required sections. Lunch and snacks were recorded daily on the same production records. However, snack production records used/left over section was not completed adequately.

11. Meal count totals for the month of review (April 2020) were not correctly combined and recorded. By the time the SSO review docs were submitted to reviewer, and reviewed, the 60-day deadline to resubmit/revise the April 2020 claim had passed and the SFA does not have a 36month One Time Exception claim available at this time. This was deemed a non-systemic error and contributed toward fiscal action calculations.

Discussed how current system allowed for this to happen and potential changes that could be made to ensure it doesn't continue. Please provide a written description of changes to the system that have been implemented to ensure that meal counts will be accurately transcribed into monthly claims.

12. Meal counts for each meal service during the Discussed that each meal service month of review were not correctly recorded. Specifically, one meal count sheet was used for both lunch and snack counts.
