 - Chapter submissions in the CTE Data Portal WILL NOT replace the need to report students to the CTSO national offices





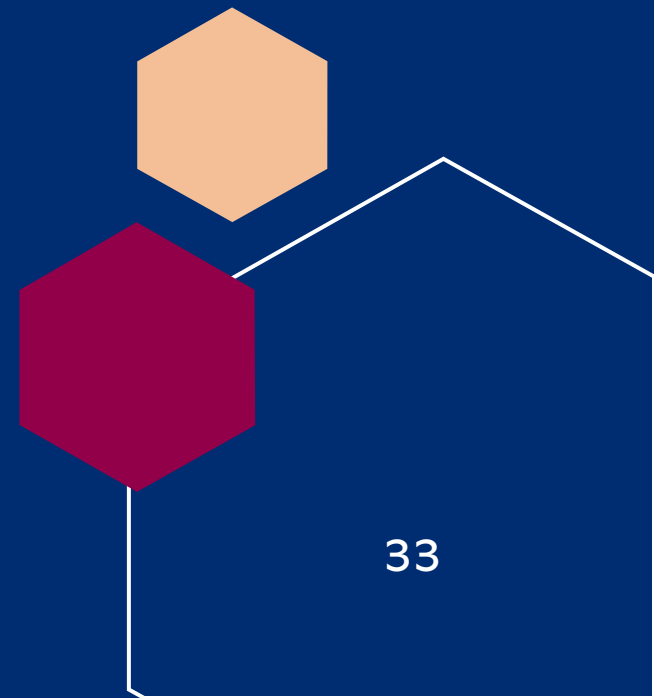
