INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING

Please use these instructions to help you complete the Arizona Summer EBT (SUN Bucks) Application - Summer 2026 for all children in your household for whom you are requesting Summer EBT benefits. Provide the name of each household member. Provide a SNAP, TANF, or FDIPIR case number or report the amount, source, and frequency of income for each household member (if you provide a case number in Step 2, you do not need to complete Step 4). Sign the application to certify the information provided is true and correct. You may designate a non-household member as your authorized representative to complete and submit this application on your behalf if you have difficulty completing the application process. You only need to submit one application per household. The application must be filled out completely to certify your children for SUN Bucks benefits. Households that are moving, planning to move, or have recently relocated must apply for benefits in the state or area where the child will complete, or has completed, the school year immediately preceding the completion of the application.

By signing the application, that household member is promising that all information has been truthfully and completely reported. Please sign, date and print your name. Provide your contact information including your address if this information is available. If you have no permanent address, this does not make your children ineligible for Summer EBT Benefits. Sharing a phone number, email address, or both is optional but providing it helps us reach you quickly if we need to contact you.

The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires that we use information from this application to determine who qualifies for Summer EBT benefits. We can only approve complete forms. We may share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them deliver program benefits to your household. Disqualification Penalties for Intentional Program Violation | 7 CFR 273.16(d): Any member of your household who intentionally makes a false or misleading statement, or misrepresents, conceals, or withholds facts in order to receive Summer EBT benefits may be subject to the following penalties:

- First violation:** Disqualification from the program for a period of 12 months.
- Second violation:** Disqualification from the program for a period of 24 months.
- Third violation:** Permanent disqualification from the program.
- In addition, any individual found to have made a fraudulent statement with respect to identity or place of residence in order to receive multiple benefits simultaneously shall be ineligible to participate in the program for a period of 10 years.
- Deliberate misrepresentation of the information provided on this application may also subject you to prosecution under applicable State and Federal criminal statutes.

The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires that we use information from this application to determine who qualifies for Summer EBT benefits. We can only approve complete forms. We may share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them deliver program benefits to your household.
